WHAT DOCUMENTATION/EXPECTATIONS REQUIRED?

- Proof of child's date of birth
- Child's immunization records
- Proof of residency – utility bill, lease
- Proof of income – Tax return, paystub
- Monthly parenting classes are required

DO I QUALIFY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

- **Child's birthday is between 9/1/2020 – 8/31/2022**
- **Child is potty-trained.**
- **Childhood immunizations up to date**
- **Household income below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level for full scholarship.**
